PROJECT BACKGROUND

Originally built in 1885 as a single storey building known as Dalmore Infant School, and latterly as Dalmore Community Centre from 1976 until 2010, the building was redeveloped and reconfigured to provide amenity flats for the elderly in 2013.

The building is C Listed which is termed as 'buildings with local importance, lesser examples of any period, style, or building type, as originally constructed or altered'.

SUMMARY OF WORKS

Operating as Clackmannanshire Councils External Fabric Upgrades contractor, McConnell was instructed to assess the building and develop proposals for upgrading the roof coverings, as well as all associated roofing features and to restore and refit the heritage rainwater features.
